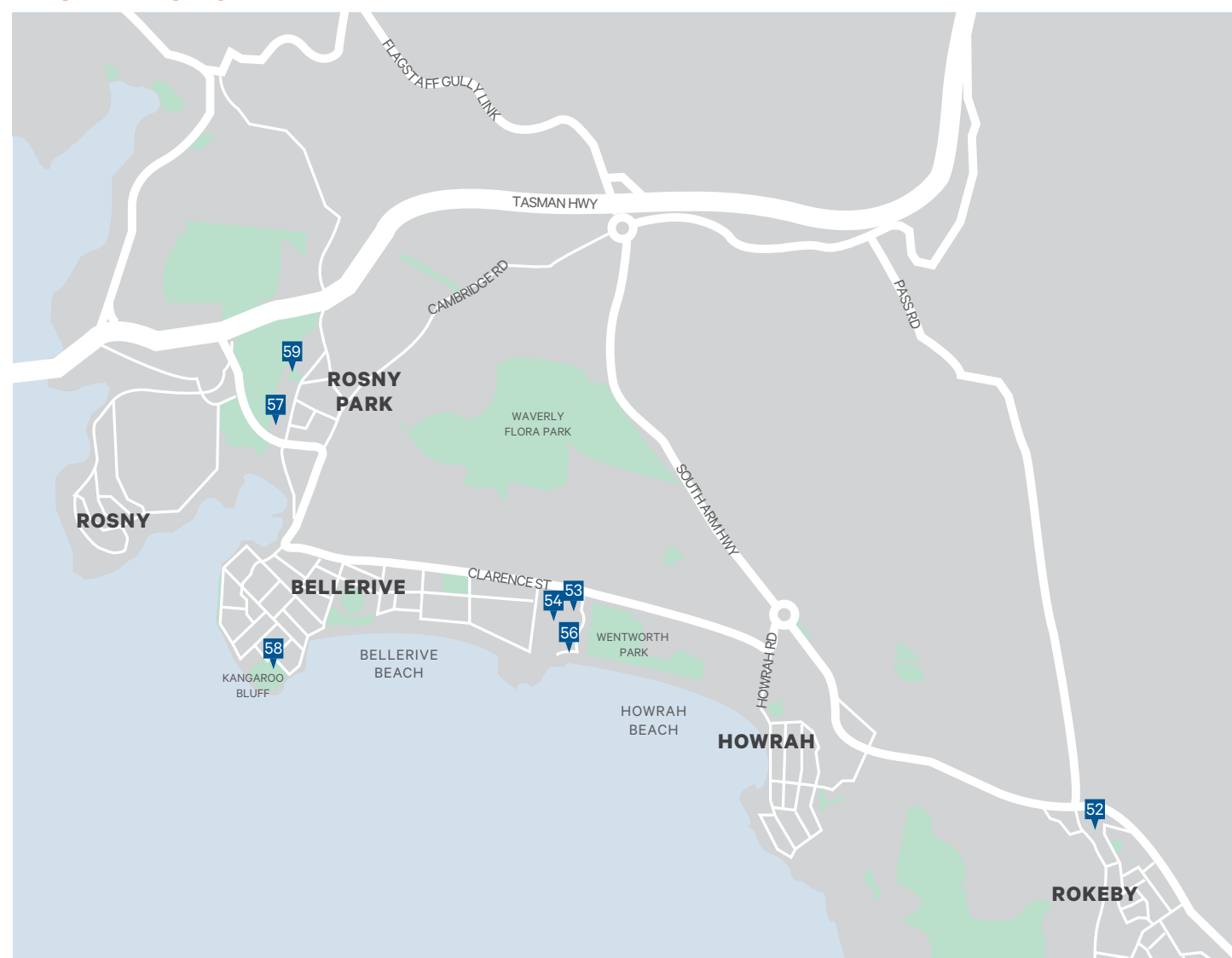

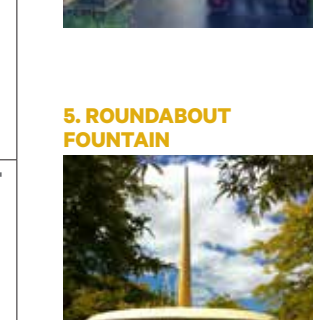

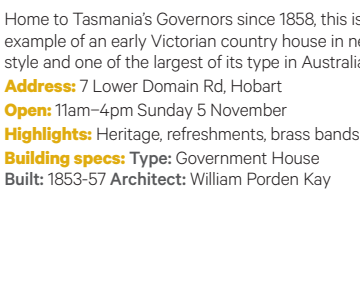
1. GOVERNMENT HOUSE TASMANIA
 Home to Tasmania's Governors since 1858, this is a fine example of an early Victorian country house in neo-Gothic style and one of the largest of its type in Australia.

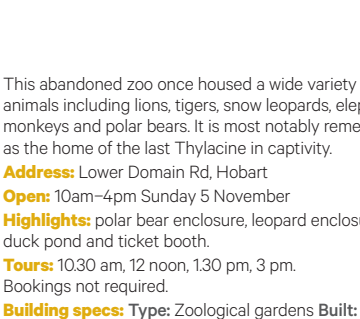
2. DOMAIN HOUSE
 A schoolhouse that has stood the test of time with several incarnations as an educational institution, opening in 1850 as the High School of Hobart Town, becoming the University of Tasmania in 1892, and subsequently used by a variety of Tasmanian educational institutions.

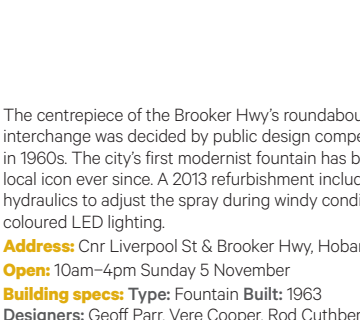
3. BEAUMARIS ZOO
 This abandoned zoo once housed a wide variety of animals including lions, tigers, snow leopards, elephants, monkeys and polar bears. It is most notably remembered as the home of the last Thylacine in captivity.

4. VICTORIA GUNPOWDER MAGAZINE
 Tucked away on the Queen's Domain, the historic Victoria Gunpowder Magazine was built in 1851 with vaulted ceilings and a similarly shaped basement. An extra bay was added in 1861. It was used as an explosives magazine until 1970.

5. ROUNDABOUT FOUNTAIN
 The centrepiece of the Brooker Hwy's roundabout interchange was decided by public design competition in 1960s. The city's first modernist fountain has been a local icon ever since. A 2013 refurbishment includes new hydraulics to adjust the spray during windy conditions and coloured LED lighting.

6. CORINDA
 One of Hobart's biggest and best located private homes, Corinda was built in the 1880s by wealthy timber merchant Alfred Crisp. Tasmanian blackwood and Huon pine and used throughout this fine house atop Hobart's historic Glebe, with views of kunanyi Mt Wellington.
